Teak wood is one of the most resilient timbers for outdoor use. It is recognized for its durability and stability under severe climatic conditions. These qualities, combined with the excellent workmanship in the construction of this collection, ensure long life in outdoor environments. The unique blend of the grain and coloring can vary from light to dark brown. Teak wood has a natural oil content that resists fungal stains, termites, and other insects that can destroy wood. This increases the lifespan of the material and is the reason why teak is superior compared to many other wood species.

This collection is created with Grade A FSC® certified teak. This is the highest quality of teak, and the high durability allows for the beautiful unfinished color and grain to shine.

Due to the inherent nature of the wood, there may be slight variations in the color and tone. New teak will show some oil surfacing, which can be gently washed away.



The color of new, unaged teak is a golden-brown. The wood will have some color variation, which will start to fade over time.

Care Instructions

- Teak furniture does not require any special maintenance routine or any additional protection apart from occasional cleaning (dust with a soft, dry cloth).
- Left to age naturally outside, teak will gradually change to a soft, silver-gray as the pigments in the surface layer of the wood begin to fade away.
- If you want see the golden-brown color that was visible in the beginning, you can use sandpaper and light sanding to remove any raised grain and restore a smooth finish to the surface.
- You can also use teak sealer to preserve the color, which will not affect the strength or longevity of the furniture in any way.



After six to twelve months of natural aging outside, the wood will start to turn more gray. The variation will start to fade and the color will become more uniform



After twelve to twenty-four months of outdoor exposure, the wood will fully soften to a nice silver-gray color.
